Workshop Economics & Politics @ Lille

December 16-17, 2026, University of Lille

The 9th Economics and Politics Workshop will be held in Lille 16-17 December. LEM-UMR9221 (Lille Univ.) organizes it, with the support of CDSP (Sciences Po Paris), CEBRIG (ULB), Dulbea (ULB) and LaRGE (Strasbourg Univ.). The workshop's aim is to bring together scholars from economics and politics interested in interdisciplinary work on public policy, political economy and public choice. We welcome theoretical as well as empirical papers by both economists and political scientists. The workshop is intended for the presentation of work-in-progress that can benefit from discussion. The selection of papers will be based on their quality and the overall coherence of the program.

Workshop Organization

There are no parallel sessions. Participation in the workshop is subject to participation in all sessions. For each paper, at least two discussion openers will be designated. Those interested in discussing a paper or willing to take part in the event should contact the organizers.

There is no conference fee. Young scholars can apply for a scholarship (see below).
